A Museum Handing the Past Down to the Present





After the Ottoman Russian Wars of 1877-78 (93 War), there were many civil, military and religious architectural structures in Baltic architecture style built in Kars, which was dominated by Russians for 40 years. Two wooden doors belonging to a church built in the 19th century and destroyed in the middle of the 20th century are on display in Kars Museum. On these doors made of wood material, with the technique of scraping and embossing, eagle relief standing on both sides of a ring on the pediment of the door, besides floral and geometric ornaments, increases the artistic value of the door



Gold Earrings in the form of lynx: The artifact from the Middle Ages was found on the Silk Road Caravan Trade route passing through Ani Ruins, an important trade center in the 10th and 11th centuries. The finely crafted lynx-shaped gold earrings showing the richness of the period are not found in the region at all.



In the garden of the museum, zoomorphic tombstones, monumental tombs and architectural remains belonging to Akkoyunlu, Karakoyunlu, Armenian, Georgian periods are exhibited. Artifacts reflecting the social, cultural, economic and military

lifestyle of people who lived in Kars and its environs in the 18th and 19th centuries and early 20th century are exhibited in the Ethnography Hall. In the archeology hall on the ground floor of the Museum Directorate building, there are artifacts belonging

to the Urartu, Roman, Byzantine, Medieval Principalities, Seljuk and Ottoman Periods as well as Paleolithic, Chalcolitic, Bronze, Iron ages are exhibited in chronological order.
