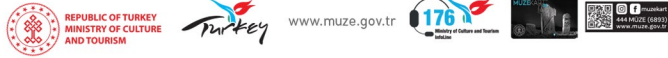

The Magnificent Witness to History





The palace represents Ottoman and Seljuk architectural styles. Especially stone carvings decorations and reliefs on the main gate and artistic works on the inner parts of the mosque reflects the Ottoman art style.

The sculptures, human in front, then lion and eagle at back, on the side looking to the town of Doğubeyazıt, symbolize the power on earth and sky.

The relief of life tree on the tomb in the complex is spectacular.



The palace was built in late 18th century, represents Late Ottoman Period art style, and it is important as Topkapı Palace for the Eastern part of Empire.



The Palace which was built on hill at the side of a mountain at 5km east of Doğubeyazıt District, completed by order of Ishak Pasha at 1874, is the last important monumental structure of the Ottoman Empire in the "Lale Devri" period. The complex was built on 7.600m² area from east to west, some parts one-storey and the other parts are two or three-storey. It has all sections for a palace (courts, meeting places, bakery, dungeon, hammam, mosque, room for harem section, the men's quarter, mausoleum, kitchen, service rooms, stable, etc.)
