The majority of the works exhibited in the exhibition hall on the top floor of the museum include clothing items reflecting the culture of peripheries of Sogut and Bilecik, woven product consists of carpets, rugs and saddles, weapons, weighing instruments and various items used in daily life. Our museum in Sogut, where the Ottoman Empire was founded, is waiting for you to witness history.



The works collected by screening from Sogut, Bilecik and villages and Eskisehir Yörük villages for display in the museum by a committee established in 1973 are the first core of the Sogut Ertugrul Gazi Museum. The artefacts were first preserved in the warehouse of the Eskişehir Archaeological Museum and brought to Sogut after the museum construction was completed and placed in the display cases.

Sogut Ertugrul Gazi Museum, first opened on 12 September 1981 opposite Ertugrul Gazi Tomb and is currently in operation in the building used as Halime Hatun Masjid, runs its operations in its current building since 08.09.2001. Museum building was built as a "Winding House" by the mayor of the municipality Memis Aga in the beginning of the 20th century. It is estimated that during its period it served as a dispensary, or health centre in today's name. The building, which has three floors, is a manifestation of woodwork.
