Flag

The embroidery and writing on the red atlas fabric of the flag is made of yellow laces. There is the phrase "Long Liv e The Homeland" in Ottoman Turkish on the upper part of the front side, and an Ottoman Imperial coat of arms surrounded with wreath in the middle. Three figures of star & crescent were embroidered, two of which is beneath and one is over the coat of arms. In the lower section, the following phrase is written "A reminder of Draw 24 of Battalion 2 of Regiment 67 in Baş Mosque of Flour Market of Denizli Bazaar". There are two figures of star & crescent, one at each upper corner of the back. The edges are fringed with wire glitter. It is dated back to Hegira 1327, Gregorian 1811. In the protest rally against the occupation of İzmir by the Greeks, Mufti Ahmet Hulusi Efendi made his historical speech under this flag and invited the people of Denizli to fight a battle.

It is understood from the obtained information to be built in the late 19th century although there is no certain document about the construction date of the building. It has Chios style with its facade features, architectural plan, window form and ornaments. The two-storey building has a floor plan with middle anteroom and rooms that are opening to this anteroom.

It was used as political party building in the first years of the Republic and Mustafa Kemal ATATÜRK was hosted there for one night when he came to Denizli on February 4, 1931. After 1950, it was allocated to the Ministry of Health and used as Tuberculosis Dispensary for a period. Starting from 1981, the 100th anniversary of Atatürk's birth, to the end of 1983, restoration and display arrangements of the building were carried out and opened to visit as a museum on February 1, 1984.
