The building, which was built by the last Germiyan ruler Yakup II (1387-1429) as the almshouse of the social complex, was restored and opened for visits as the "Tile Museum" in 1999. Yakup II's tiled sarcophagus is located in the tomb of the building, which is called as "Gökşadırvan" by the locals because of its solid marble fountain. The foundation inscription of the madrasa, which was located next to the almshouse but collapsed in 1930s, now placed in the south niche of the entrance door and consists of thirty nine lines and written in Turkish with Ottoman letters, is an important historical source. In the museum, tiles produced from 14th century to present time are exhibited.

The museum of the tiles, also known as "flowers blooming in fire" is waiting for you in Kütahya which is in the creative cities list of UNESCO with its tile art in the field of craft and folk arts.
