the Kalehöyük excavation site has no other example of its kind in our country or in the world. By virtue of its characteristics, the museum received The 'Best Green Museum Award' in 2010. Pieces from Kalehöyük, Yassıhöyük, and Büklükalehöyük mounds are exhibited in the Museum in separate sections in chronological order. The exhibition halls are enriched by visuals as well as technological features. Visitors attended activities such as ceramic making on potter's wheel, cuneiform script, clay-mud figurine making, jewelry design, coin minting, and seal printing are organized in addition to drama activities for visitor groups.

The area consisting of Kalehöyük Archaeological Museum, which is located in Kırşehir Province, the Japanese Garden right next to it, Japanese-Anatolian Archaeological Institute, and the Kalehöyük excavation site is noticeable since it is the only example of its kind both in Turkey and in the world. Kalehöyük Archaeology Museum, the construction of which was started in 2008 with the cultural cooperation of the Turkish and Japanese governments, has been opened in 2010, and has a design inspired by the physical form of Kalehöyük Mound. The interior of the Museum has been designed so that visitors can perceive the methods and observe the excavations as well as seeing the artifacts found.
