Gypsum work is seen on the plaster molded decorated cookers and skylight windows of the Pasha Room and the Poolside Room. The motif called "Mühr-ü Süleyman" (Seal of Suleyman) is used on the plastered stained glass skylight windows. In 1988, Latifoğlu Mansion, which was equipped with the furniture and clothes of the region and made a live and realistic exhibition with mannequins, was built as a Museum-House in Tokat Museum where Tokat's traditional home culture was reflected.



It is known that the Latifoğlu Mansion, located on Gaziosmanpaşa Boulevard in Tokat Center, was built in 1746 in the Ottoman baroque style. Latifoglu Mansion, built on an "L" shaped plan with a mudbrick filling material between wooden carcasses, has rich wood, plaster and pencil decorations. Wooden ceiling, doors, hoods and cupboard doors of the Turkish bath room are decorated with floral motifs. Pasha room with baroque wooden ceiling core, cupboard and hood covers and gate reflects beautiful examples of wood craftsmanship. The poolside room on the second floor attracts attention with its gilded wooden ceiling belly as well as the walls decorated with floral motifs and Istanbul depictions.
